

He also completed a bachelor of arts degree in criminal justice from CSUSB and graduated from in 2008 from SBVC's Extended Basic Police Academy.

scholarships helped him get his associate's degree and will help him as he progresses to the University of California, Riverside this fall.



2010 Graduates Celebrate

Under the brightness of a sun-drenched morning, an even brighter future was unlocked for 450 graduates at San Bernardino Valley College's 83rd Annual Commencement held on the morning of Friday, May 21st in the SBVC Football Stadium.



The largest graduating class in over 15 years (1,299) showed up en masse (450) in celebratory caps and gowns and overflowed the dedicated student seating section before their names were read and they walked victoriously across the commencement stage.

Eighteen year old commencement student speaker Brittany Singleton-Faz livened

up the crowd with a celebratory message about how the challenging times of the economic environment aren't tough enough to keep graduates from pursuing their dreams. Before she received her degree, Singleton-Faz reminded her fellow graduates that success is a journey, not a destination.

Flanked by the SBCCD Board of Trustees and chief administrators, SBVC President Dr. Debra Daniels presided over the ceremony. Dr. Daniels delivered a commencement address that recognized eight former Japanese-American students who were forcibly removed from SBVC during World War II due to then-President Franklin D. Roosevelt's Executive Order 9066. The former students were honored in absentia as part of the California Nisei Project that was established in October 2009 after passage of Assembly Bill 37 in the California State Assembly. Her message about how "choice not chance" revealed how many of those students went on to achieve great lifetime accomplishments was met with a standing ovation from graduates and guests alike.

A New Look for San Bernardino Valley College

Have you been to Valley College lately? If not, you're sure to find something new as a lot has changed with recent demolitions and new construction. Due to the San Jacinto fault line, SBVC has undergone a lot of change..take a look at what's new!

1996

In an attempt to replace North Hall, it was discovered that the San Jacinto fault runs through the campus. Seven buildings were being compromised and deemed needing to be replaced because of the 200 foot wide fault zone:

- Administration Library Life Science
- Campus Center
 Art Gallery
- Art Building
 Medical Arts

FEMA allocated \$34 million to demolish the 7 buildings and construct the 5 new buildings. The State also contributed \$11 million, plus another \$6.7 million for seismic upgrades.

New buildings:

- Library Health/Life Science
- Administration/Student Services
- Campus Center
 Art Center/Gallery

Steven Ehrlich Architects and Thomas Blurock architects were chosen to design the new buildings.

<u>2002</u>

Groundbreaking for the new Library occurs and the District pursues general obligation bond to help offset construction costs. Measure P, \$190 million general obligation bond, passed in November, 2002. A Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee was also created.

<u>2004</u>

The Library/Learning Resource Center opened in September.

2005

The Health & Life Science and the Administration/ Student Services buildings were dedicated on May 13th and demolition of the "classic" buildings began.

SBVC's Campus Center was dedicated on May 3, 2006.

2007

The Art Center and the Art Gallery were completed in April and the Child Development Center was completed in May.

The Student Health Services Center was completed.

2009

The Maintenance and Operations (M&O) building was completed in March.

<u>2010</u>

The Media & Communications building and North Hall Replacement are complete and ready for classes to start in fall. The new Media & Communications building will house a media broadcasting center (KVCR) as well as an education building which includes studios, program stage areas, assembly area, meeting rooms, library/tutoring rooms, and offices.

North Hall Replacement includes classrooms, offices and a multi-purpose room.

There are many more changes to come to San Bernardino Valley College, including a new parking structure, a renovation of the Business Building and a new Athletics Complex. Keep your eye out for future issues of Movers & Shakers to watch the progress.

Cross Country "4-peat" Winners!

This May, SBVC Cross Country team members were honored in a ring ceremony, in part for their participation in San Bernardino Valley's fourth consecutive state championship, in the sport, and the twelfth in any sport since the school was founded. Led by two returners from the 2008 state championship team, San Bernardino steamrolled through the Foothill Conference and Southern California Regional meets before posting a 66-point victory in the state meet in Fresno. The 66-point victory over their nearest opponent, Orange Coast College, is 39 points higher than last year, and is 54 points higher than in 2007.
