Caduceus Club

Applicants must be active members in the Caduceus Club and must have completed 12 or more units with a 3.0 grade point average or higher.

Jessica Contreras

Antonio Vidal MEChA Leadership Scholarship

Recipients should be active members of the MEChA organization who have completed 12 or more units with a 2.0 grade point average or higher and hold a current membership card. The MEChA advisor selects the recipients. Antonio Vidal was an active member of the SBVC community serving as MEChA chair for several years. Antonio was very involved as a leader throughout California and the Southwest on issues of education and equality for all oppressed peoples.

Catherine Almanza Hector Guzman

SBCCD Black Faculty & Staff Association

The BFS Association was formed to identify and support the interests and concerns of Black faculty and staff, including the recruitment, retention, education and mentoring of African American students. The scholarship recipient must be enrolled in 12 or more units. He/she must have a 2.0 grade point average, meet graduation requirements, and must be a liberal arts or vocational major.

Patrice Clark Joyce Green

SBVC Alumni Association

SBVC alumni contribute to this scholarship. It is for students in any major who have completed 60 or more units by the end of the spring semester with a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or higher and who are active participants in campus and community activities.

Ruben Vasquez

SBVC Classified Senate Scholarship

The student must be enrolled in a minimum of 9 units with a 2.5 grade point average. Must show that he/she has leadership qualities and must have participated in community service/activities. Two recommendations must be submitted: one by an SBVC faculty member and one by a classified employee. Michelle Crocfer, past president of the Classified Senate and the board members were instrumental in setting up this scholarship.

Kevin White

SBVC Faculty Association

The Faculty Association awards scholarships to students who have completed at least one year at the college with a 3.0 or higher grade point average and who have participated in the life of the college outside of the classroom.

Olivia Milligan

SBVC Honors Program

The Honors Scholarship is awarded to a student who is a member of the Honors Program. The student must have served on the Honors Program Student Committee, completed 2 or more honors classes and completed 3 out of 4 public service points. The Honors Program Advisors select the students.

Lydia Faitaila Stuart Chapin

SBVC Latino Faculty Staff & Administrators Association (LFSAA)

The LFSAA was formed to identify and support the interests and concerns, including the recruitment, retention, education, and mentoring of Latino students. The association provides scholarships to assist students with their studies.

The SBCCD Latino Faculty Staff and Administrators Scholarship is open to all students who hold a 2.5 GPA or higher and have completed 30 or more transferable units with a preference for those students with campus involvement, volunteer or community service, financial need and Latino/a decent.

Alenadra Ivanez Ruben Vasquez

LFSAA Ochoa Leadership Scholarship

The SBCCD LFSAA Ochoa Leadership Award is awarded to students who hold a 2.5 GPA or higher with a preference for students that demonstrate evidence of leadership in campus organizations, Latino/a decent, have a family with dependents, volunteer with sports organizations, identified as an under-dog student with exceptional barriers, involvement with MADD (or other advocacy with alcohol/drugs). This scholarship is named in honor of Gina Ochoa, who served on the LFSAA executive board and was an active member for many years. She was a long-standing advocate for students, staff and the Latino Community until her passing in October 2009.

Mirella Campos


SBVC Math Department

Tom Akin Memorial Scholarship Awards

G. Thomas Akin was the president of his own national, commercial art company which specializes in exhibits and interpretative museum displays. Tom first became interested in SBVC when he agreed to serve on the Commercial Art Program Board, and subsequently he became a regular student in the glassblowing classes. Four scholarships are awarded for artistic excellence. Each recipient is selected by unanimous agreement of the faculty in the Art Department.

Gloria Alemán Memorial

Gloria Alemán came from Mexico at the age of 9, was a devoted wife of 35 years and the best mother to her four children. Three of her four children attended and worked at SBVC, one of whom has worked there for 19 years. Gloria also worked at SBVC for a short time in the campus Bookstore. Recipients must have completed 12 units at SBVC, plan to transfer to a four-year institution with a minimum 2.0 grade point average. Preference is given to Mexican-American students.

Patricia Robles-Alvarez

James O. Almaraz Memorial

James Almaraz was a student at SBVC enrolled in the Puente Program and majoring in the physical and biological sciences. In the summer of 1995, James was killed near his home. This scholarship will be awarded to a past or present Puente student, with a 2.75 or higher grade point average. He/she must major in physical and biological science and must have completed 24 units of college work by the end of the spring semester. The instructors of Puente select the recipient.

Cindy Herrera-Gonzalez

Sam & Frankie Andrews Memorial

Sam Andrews served on the San Bernardino Valley College Board of Trustees from 1930-1960. This scholarship is for students returning to SBVC for a second year of study and who intend to earn a bachelor's degree.

Renee Limpus

Roger C. Anton Memorial

Roger Anton joined the SBVC faculty in 1946 as a professor in the department of foreign languages. He was appointed president of Crafton Hills College in 1974 where he served with distinction until his untimely death in 1976. Recipients must have completed 60 units by the conclusion of the spring semester with a 3.0 or higher grade point average, must have completed the equivalent of three semesters of foreign language, and intend to enter the teaching profession.

Armando Ordonez

Dr. Gordon C. Atkins Memorial

Dr. Atkins served as professor of philosophy, chair of the Social Science Division, and registrar from 1947-1966. This scholarship is for students majoring in philosophy or religious studies (including pre-ministerial studies) that have completed a minimum of 24 transferable units with a 2.75 or higher grade point average.

Ian Giddens

Don & Carol Averill Career & Technical Education Scholarship

Dr. Donald F. Averill spent over 40 years in higher education, most of it promoting career and technical education. He served as Chancellor of the San Bernardino Community College District from 2000-2008. The student must be enrolled in any of SBVC's technical education disciplines in a certificate program as a freshman or sophomore with a minimum 2.0 grade point average or higher.

Richard Johnson

Russell Baldwin Memorial

Russell Baldwin was a member of the San Bernardino Valley College faculty from 1947 until his retirement in 1978. He taught music theory and composition, music history and piano and served as head of the department. He also served as president of the Spinet club and as an organist and choir director for several local churches. He was an accomplished composer. Baldwin's composition "Concertino in F major for Piano and Orchestra" was composed and performed for the commemoration of San Bernardino Valley College's 50th anniversary in 1976. Exceptional music students, preferably in piano, and intending to transfer to a four-year college are eligible.

Roger Nelson

Myrtle Bard Memorial

Myrtle Bard was deeply involved in the cultural activities of the San Bernardino area. She had a prominent role int he saving and restoration of the California Theatre and the development and expansion of the symphony orchestra. For many years, Bard served on the Board of Directors of the San Bernardino Civic Light Operat. Recipients must have completed 12 units, have a 2.0 grade point average and be continuing their studies at SBVC.

Keith Ennis

Beaver Medical Clinic Foundation Scholarship

This scholarship is designed for a student purusing studies at SBVC toward an R.N. degree. The Foundation grants scholarships to schools throughout the Inland Empire. The scholarship committee of the Everett-Hunter Department of Nursing selects the recipients.

Misty Gaastra

Charles Beeman Memorial

Chuck Beeman served as track coach for San Bernardino Valley College and served as a trustee for the San Bernardino Community College District from 1983-2009. He and his brother opened Beeman's Pharmacy. This scholarship will be awarded to a transfer student with a junior standing. The student must have earned at least 24 units with a 3.0 grade point average and be pursuing a career in the health professions. Science and engineering majors may also be considered.

Dung Nguyen

Bridgestone/Firestone Scholarship

The Bridgestone/Firestone Scholarship is limited to automotive and technician certificate students who have completed 12 or more units with a 2.5 or better grade point average. The Automotive Department will make the selections.

James Colbert

Felicie Bronner Memorial

Mrs. Armande Mollé of San Bernardino established this scholarship in memory of her mother. Bronner scholarships are for students beginning their second year of study at SBVC. The award is based on academic achievement, community service, leadership, good citizenship and financial need.

Christian Espinoza

Harold Brown Memorial Scholarship

Mr. Brown worked for the federal government in the Federal Civil Service Commission. He believed that education enhanced the life and the purpose of a person. There are no specifications on the selection of this scholarship.

Anthony Garcia Randy Fritter

Cancer Federation Scholarship

The scholarship is based on grades, community service, and dedication. Candidates must be biology majors who plan to research, become teachers or physicians or nursing majors.

Shawna Foor Louise Essimbi

Win & Bette Carl Memorial Scholarship

A longtime employee of the San Bernardino Community College District and one of the founders of the SBVC Foundation, Win Carl began this scholarship in his wife's memory before he passed away in 2010. Recipients must be full-time students, majoring in English with a 3.0 or higher GPA.

Elizabeth Finney

Lois Carson Scholarship

Lois Carson was the first minority to be elected to the San Bernardino Community College District Board of Trustees, serving from 1973-1997. She is a member of the SBVC Alumni Hall of Fame and currently serves on the Board of Directors for the San Bernardino Valley College Foundation. Scholarships are awarded to African-American students who have completed a minimum of 60 units with a 3.0 or higher grade point average.

Walter Clark

Librada Sosa Cave Memorial

Librada Sosa Cave attended SBVC's School of Nursing and always spoke highly of her educational experience. Scholarships are awarded to students enrolled in the nursing program who have a grade point average of 2.5 or higher. The scholarship committee of the Everett-Hunter Department of Nursing selects the recipients.

Jennifer Kysar

The Harold Chandler Memorial Scholarship

Dr. Harold Chandler was a professor of biology and administrator at SBVC from 1947-1986. Upon his retirement, he remained an active member of the SBVC Alumni Association until his death in 2003. Applicants should be continuing/returning students who are considering Life Science as a major with a grade point average of 3.0 transferable units. The Science Department makes the selection.

Gabriel Subuyuj

Milton P. Cheney Memorial

One of SBVC's oldest endowments, the Cheney Memorial Scholarship was established in 1939. Cheney was active in public affairs and served as county supervisor of the Fourth District in the 1920s. Applicants must have completed at least 12 units with a 2.5 grade point average and be preparing for a career in social science.

Georgina Campos

Children's Fund Scholarship

Scholarships are awarded to students who are foster youth under the jurisdiction of the San Bernardino County Department of Children's Services or emancipated Foster Youth from San Bernardino County. Applicants must be under the age of 26, pursuing a degree while maintaining a 2.5 grade point average or higher and demonstrating financial need after exhausting all other sources of institutional financial support including federal aid (FAFSA). The Foster Youth Scholarship Committee makes the selection.

Recipient still to be determined.

City of San Bernardino Confidential Management Association Scholarship

For entering freshman, the recipient should be the child of a parent who works full or part-time for the City of San Bernardino. A grade point average of 2.0 or higher is required. Preference will be given to an applicant who would be the first person in his/her immediate family to attend college.

Recipient still to be determined.

Wilma Cochrane Memorial Scholarship

Wilma Cochrane is a graduate of SBVC. She worked on the campus in various capacities for 24 years, including EOPS coordinator, general counselor and Veteran's counselor. Recipients must have a student educational plan in one of the counseling programs on campus (General Counseling, EOPS, CARE, DSPS & STAR, CalWorks, etc.). Involvement in church activities is a plus (but not mandatory). Preference will be given to students who live on the west side of San Bernardino.

Latasha McDonald

Grayce & Harold Confer Memorial

With a master's of music, Harold Confer served SBVC as a professor of music, band director, choral director, department head and Humanities Division chair from 1946 until his retirement in 1976. Students who have financial need and have completed 12 or more units with a grade point average of 2.5 or higher may apply.

Teresa Lynette Larvy Pheng

Dr. Gause Covington Memorial

The Dr. Gause Covington funds were established in the 1960s at several California Community Colleges, including SBVC. The funds assist students in vocational and technical education. This scholarship is for students in SBVC's Applied Technology & Transportation Division who will be seeking employment after completing their training at SBVC.

Mark McCafferty

Nora Parker Coy Memorial

A long time professor and administrator at SBVC, Nora Parker Coy was appointed to the faculty as a professor of English in 1932. At the time of her retirement in 1959, Coy was the director of the Evening College program. Preference is given to Latinas attending evening college at SBVC.

Adelina Abril

Culinary Arts Scholarships

These scholarships are awarded to students who have contributed extra service to their restaurant classes and who will continue their education. The Culinary Arts instructors make the selections.

Josh Hastings Reanna Herrera Kaitland Meredith Tamara Schlinkert Fidel Martinez

Distribution Management Association Endowed Logistics Scholarship

Students majoring in Warehouse/Logistics/ Transportation who will complete a certificate program or an AA degree may apply. A 2.0 or better grade point average and a one page letter stating career objectives in industry is a requirement. Faculty from the Transportation Division select the students.

Margaret Dodds-Schumacher Memorial, Part of the Osher Initative for California Community College Students

Margaret Dodds-Schumacher was an SBVC associate professor of psychology, who passed away in 2008. Born and raised in Yonkers, New York, Margaret channeled her bright, kind, and giving personality to benefit her students in academic counseling and through her online courses. She was well known for her generosity and many believe that the lives she touched, whether it was in person or online, were changed for the better. Recipients must have completed 24 units of degree-applicable study at the time of scholarship receipt, are enrolled in six units for the ensuing semester, and qualify for a Board of Governor's fee waiver.

Bobbette Lynn

Walter Douglas Memorial

Walter Douglas, a favorite professor of many students, taught for more than 30 years at SBVC. He passed away in 2001, as Professor Emeritus, Philosophy, and as a retired associate member of the San Bernardino Faculty Association. Recipients must be re-entry students at SBVC in the Second Chance program who are returning to the college in the fall and have strong letters of recommendation. This student may also be juggling college, work, and family responsibilities and may not yet qualify for other scholarships. The SBVC Scholarship Committee and Mr. Douglas' daughter will assist with the selection.

Kendra Terry Seval Haley

The Edison Green Jobs Initiative, Part of the Osher Initiative for California Community College Students

Funded by Southern California Edison and the Bernard Osher Foundation, this scholarship is for students who have completed 24 units of degree-applicable study at the time of scholarship receipt, are enrolled in six units for the ensuing semester, and qualify for a Board of Governor's fee waiver. They must be pursuing a career in GIS or Water Supply Technology.

Jimmie Bradley Mark McCafferty Rodney Noeller

Steven Ehrlich Architects Scholarship

In honor of the 2001 75th Anniversary of SBVC, campus architect Steven Ehrlich endowed this scholarship. The Library & Resource Center, AD/SS, Health Sciences, and Campus Center were all designed by Steve Ehrlich. The recipient is a student who wishes to pursue a degree in architecture.

Isac Lopez

Dr. Raymond F. Ellerman Scholarship

A long-time administrator at SBVC, Dr. Ellerman served as vice president for Business, Associate Superintendent and Chancellor encompassing the years of 1957-1971. He was an accomplished musician preferring the instruments of clarinet and flute. Recipients will be continuing students active in a performing group and/or in music and must have a grade point average of 2.5 or higher.

Taylor Williams

Linda Ewing Memorial

A 1977 SBVC nursing alumna, Linda Susan Ewing worked as a R.N. for nine years at Loma Linda University Medical Center until the time of her death at age 33. Students in the R. N. program may apply. The scholarship committee of Everett-Hunter Department of Nursing selects the recipients.

Dean Kaitschuck

Agnes & Eugene Farrar Memorial Scholarship

Eugene Farrar was a professor in the SBVC business department in the 1950s. Agnes Farrar supported her husband through his master's and doctoral programs. Two awards are given annually to students who have had to overcome a physical hardship in order to receive their college education.

Irais Garcia Israel Lopez

G. A. T. O. (Giving Another the Opportunity) Scholarship

Magi Lawson, a graduate of SBVC, established this scholarship in memory of her father who was African American and spoke Spanish fluently. He taught Spanish to students interested in working within the Job Corp. The applicant must be an African American student with a 2.0 grade point average who is pursuing Spanish as a second language. The Scholarship Committee, with help from the donor, will select the recipients.

Se'kasha Joyce

Kevin T. Gustafson & Ruth Gustafson Buffum Memorial Scholarship

A student at SBVC, Kevin Gustafson's life ended before she had the opportunity to fulfill her potential. Kevin's mother, Ruth Gustafson Buffum, was the executive secretary to the Chancellor of the San Bernardino Community College District. She passed away in 2003 and left a bequest to establish this scholarship. The Gustafson scholarship is awarded to students majoring in computer science. A 2.5 or higher grade point average is required.

Joshua Morgan Anthony Jennings

William Harrison Memorial

William Harrison graduated from SBVC in 1935. He was the owner of Harrison Sporting Goods and provided many gifts of service to SBVC. Since 1947, the William Harrison Memorial Scholarships have been awarded to the Male & Female Athletes of the Year.

Daniel Angulo April Fultz

William S. Hellyer Memorial Scholarship

William "Bill" Hellyer graduated from San Bernardino Valley Union Junior College in 1934. He retired in 1995 after 55 years as an attorney with the law firm of Reid & Hellyer. Mr. Hellyer was named one of SBVC's 75 People of Distinction. The Hellyer scholarships are awarded to students preparing for a career in law who have completed a minimum of 30 transferable units with a 3.5 grade point average or higher.

Sarah Jenkins

Estelle Heydenfeldt Memorial Scholarship

Estelle Heydenfeldt was an accomplished musician and outstanding student. She graduated from SBVC in 1948, was a member of the SBVC band, Alpha Gamma Sigma, and president of Phi Lambda Delta. The Estelle Heydenfeldt Memorial Scholarship was established by her sister Dorothy O'Bryan, who is also a SBVC alumna (1951) and was, like Estelle and her brother Stan (1949), active in music at the college. Preference is given to a returning student with a 3.0 grade point average or higher in any major.

Teresa Hixson

John Hile Memorial

John Hile was president and manager of Santa Fe Federal Savings. He was a member of several service clubs including Elks and Kiwanis and taught part-time at SBVC. This scholarship is for students who have completed 12 units or more with a grade point average of 2.0 or higher.

Vinh Ho Kingsley Iwu

Edward "Duke" & Evelyn Hill Scholarship

Edward "Duke" Hill graduated from SBVC in 1949. He has served the city and people of San Bernardino in many areas, including as trustee of the San Bernardino Symphony Association and the San Bernardino Area Chamber of Commerce. Evelyn Bemis graduated from Valley College in 1950. She was an avid volunteer in the community until she passed away in 2010. Students majoring in business administration and planning a career in business may apply. Preference is given to applicants who have an interest in the field of real estate and who have served the college or community in some volunteer capacity. Applicants must have completed a minimum of 30 units with a 2.5 or higher grade point average.

Masako Hirata Scholarship

Recipients for the scholarship must be a liberal arts major who will transfer to a four-year college to earn a teaching certificate. Special consideration is given to students of Japanese descent.

Andrew Sanchez

Dr. Raymond Paul Hively Memorial

Dr. Hively was vice president of the Associated Student Body. As a physician he founded the San Francisco Emergency Medical Association and authored a book about imaging and healing. This scholarship is for students transferring to a four-year college with a minimum of 60 units, a cumulative grade point average of 3.5 or higher and majoring in a health field (pre-med, dentistry, etc.).

Paul Parrish

Frederick H. Hull, M.D. & Mildred I. Hull Memorial

Dr. Frederick Hull came to San Bernardino after serving in the U.S. Navy during World War II. He was an ophthalmologist and the physician on duty in 1954 when Sammy Davis, Jr. was admitted to San Bernardino Community Hospital after a car accident. Dr. Hull performed surgery to remove Sammy's damaged eye. This scholarship is for students majoring in a health science field.

Gabriel Subuyuj

Kenneth & Pauline Hunter Memorial

The Hunter Scholarships are made possible by the generosity of Kenneth & Pauline Everett Hunter. Pauline Everett graduated from SBVC in 1939 and taught in the San Bernardino City Schools until she retired in 1981. Students are eligible to apply for this award if they are accepted into the Everett-Hunter Department of Nursing and have completed the majority of their prerequisites at SBVC. The scholarship committee of Everett-Hunter Department of Nursing selects the recipients.

This scholarship is available to incoming first year students and to returning SBVC students who attended Inghram Elementary School or for those needing assistance with textbooks.

Keyes was a running back for the San Francisco 49ers and Oakland Raiders, a high school teacher and coach, a liaison to minorities; appointed by Governor Ronald Reagan and corporate director of Urban Affairs for Lockheed Aircraft Corporation. Scholarships are available for full-time students with a 2.75 grade point average or higher. Students must be interested in politics.

Penelope Mendez

Kiwanis Club of Colton

The Kiwanis Club of Colton established a textbook scholarship for graduates of Colton or Grand Terrace High School.

Anary Landeros

Thelma Knea Memorial

Thelma Knea gave 28 years of distinguished service to SBVC, including 27 years as the administrative assistant to three presidents. Business, liberal arts or science majors may apply. The applicants must have completed 30 units with a minimum of a 3.0 grade point average.

The student must have a 3.0 cumulative grade point average, must have applied for financial aid and may have any major.

George & Ada Lee Mattison Memorial

A graduate of Southwestern College in Winfield, Kansas, Ada Lee Mattison taught for many years in Colton and Fontana schools. She believed in education and found numerous ways to help students who need encouragement. Awards are for students who have not previously been scholarship recipients.

Teresa Laycock Jonathon Portney

Donald D. McCawley Memorial

Donald McCawley was a life sciences professor for SBVC and an alumnus. Recipients must have completed the pre-nursing program at SBVC and be accepted into the Registered Nurses program at the college. The scholarship committee of the Everett-Hunter Department of Nursing selects the recipients.

J. W. McDaniel Memorial

J.W. McDaniel served as an administrator at SBVC from 1944-1969. His duties included director of Student Personnel, registrar, counselor, curriculum, vice president of Instruction, and president. He worked 40 years for SBVC, was selected as Outstanding Professor in 1992 and received a lifetime achievement award from the SBVC Faculty Association in 2001. A student returning to SBVC and who has a 3.0 or higher grade point average with a minimum of 24 units is selected. The Biology Department Committee selects the recipient.

Charles "Chuck" Obershaw is an alumnus of SBVC who owned and operated a Toyota dealership in San Bernardino for a number of years. A graduate of SBVC, Mary Shook served 41 years as a secretary at the college. She did volunteer work with Habitat for Humanity and served numerous organizations including Zonta Club, the SBVC Alumni Association, and the Republican Women's Federation. Recipients must be continuing or returning students majoring in office information systems. Preference will be given to those who are employed and enrolled on a part-time basis.

Dr. Donald L. Singer Scholarship

Dr. Singer served as president of Crafton Hills College (1982-1990) and as president of San Bernardino Valley College (1990-1997). This scholarship is for a student enrolled in the Television Production certificate program who has completed at least 15 units, but has at least one course remaining to complete the certificate. The student must have a grade point average of 2.8 or higher in the program to be eligible. The scholarship is to be used for communications course tuition the semester following the one in which it is awarded. The Communications/Broadcasting Department nominates and selects the recipient.

Luís Torrez Memorial

Luís Ibarra Torrez moved to San Bernardino after World War II. He owned a restaurant on Fifth Street for several years. He met and married his wife, Calista Roseana Torrez and they became parishioners at Our Lady of Guadalupe Catholic Church on Fifth Street.
